"Secret" Prayer

"But when thou prayest, enter into thy chamber: and when thou hast shut thy door, pray unto thy Father which is in secret, and thy Father which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly." Matthew 6:6 (Geneva Bible, 1599).

The Puritans, who were our fore-fathers and mothers in the faith, incorporated into their daily routines what they referred to as "secret", or personal, prayer. Their daily practice, however, was considerably more involved than what most us would think of as daily prayer. The term included self-examination and confession, meditation, scripture reading, intercessory prayer, and various spiritual disciplines, like journaling, service to the poor, fasting, and reading theological books. All this effort was directed to cultivating the strong, abiding faith which would lead to an honest and earnest relationship with God.

All of us want to be in that kind of relationship with God, but it can seem overwhelming sometimes. How do you even get started developing spiritual habits like that? Well, like with any habit worth having, you pick a place and start. One of the easier places for me to get started was reading books about God and faith – I had a cup of coffee every morning, and so I started reading while I was drinking my coffee. Some days, it was only a page or two, but even a page or two was enough to get me thinking. And it was enough to make me hungry for more. It doesn't matter so much where you start, just that you take the next step.

Westminster is living in something of an "in-between" time right now. The visioning work we did together is done, but we must wait while the Pastor Nominating Committee does its work. And we can all be honest with each other, it's hard to be patient! But perhaps this is another place where we can each work on our "secret" prayer life. Find out what our confessions say about pastors and preachers; examine your own behavior for signs of impatience or wanting your own way; meditate on Scriptures that encourage us to wait on God's time; renew or begin service in one of our local ministries or missions. It doesn't matter where you start. Just take a step.

But whatever else you do, please pray - both in "secret" and when we gather. Pray for the members of the PNC, by name. Pray they will have the mind of Christ, and be willing to work through their disagreements to attain unity. Pray God will grant them wisdom. Pray for the next pastor, that God is filling them, even now, with a passion to preach the Word. Pray, as well, that they will have a sure sense of God's call to this church. And pray for the members of Westminster. Pray for patience and commitment to the common values we identified. Pray for an openness to God's will for our future, and for a sense of peace when a final selection is made.

Why Loaves & Fishes?

From time to time, you might wonder why our volunteers have such a passion for Loaves & Fishes Food Pantry? Why do we constantly collect and give food? Pantry Coordinator Jan Kosowski reminds all of us that we take our lead from the Bible and it's a lesson worth remembering. Matthew 14:15-21 New International Version (NIV)

Each week L & F clients can barely carry all the food they receive, and extra food is taken to Geneva Tower. ²¹The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children. Thousands of people are served by Loaves & Fishes every year.

Jesus did not teach us to feed only those we think are deserving; he taught us to feed all who are in need.

¹⁵As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food."

¹⁶Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." So the members of West-minster and Christ Episcopal obeyed their Master and created a food pantry.

¹⁷"We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered.

¹⁸ Bring them here to me," he said. ¹⁹ And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. *Each week before the pantry opens the volunteers gather for prayer*. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. ²⁰ They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.

Needles Click, Warmth Spreads...

Twice a month, the small parlor off the Sanctuary fills with sounds of chatter, the smell of coffee and the sounds of good friends coming together for a common cause. It's Westminster's Prayer Shawl Ministry. The group started in February 2004. To date, they have given away nearly 500 prayer shawls. Recipients have ranged from new parents to members who have suffered the loss of a loved one.

One of the most memorable special projects was their "Save the Penguins" project in 2014. Members knitted sweaters for penguins that had been affected by oil spills in Australia.

Linda Smith wrote about that amazing effort in her column, "From the Knitting Basket."

"All things bright and beautiful; all creatures great and small. All things wise and wonderful; the Lord God made them." We learned the penguins in Australia were in need of hand knitted sweaters to wear. It sounded intriguing! Penguins are being covered in oil from oil spills in the ocean. They are poisoned and die from picking at the oil on their feathers. The sweaters provide a barrier to prevent them from ingesting the oil before workers are able to clean it off. A request went out over the internet that included a pattern for the sweater. We went right to work! And now, we are packing a box full of sweaters to mail off to Australia. Our group is excited to help protect God's creatures in our own small way. "A righteous man cares for the needs of his animal." Proverbs 12:10 (NIV)
