## **An Inviting Atmosphere**

When was the last time you visited another church for the first time? For some it has been a long time. I consider myself fairly outgoing, but admittedly can still find visiting a totally new congregation intimidating. I am wondering if I will stand up when I am supposed to stand, sit when I am supposed to sit, know any of the songs and, of course, know where the restroom is, if necessary (at least at my age).

Certainly if we are visiting with a family member or a friend we have an advantage, because we can always ask them questions. I have over the course of the years visited many churches. Some were very inviting, with people coming up to welcome me, asking who I was, and even introducing me to a few others. Other churches I entered, I felt like I was visiting someone else's "family reunion." They all seemed friendly, at least to each other, but passed by me as if I was invisible.

Thomas Bandy in his book, "<u>Kicking Habits: Welcome Relief For Addicted Congregations</u>" notes that "every dying church is a friendly church." The people are friendly......at least to each other. Oh, they may greet each other during the passing of the peace, but there is not much initiative to spend time visiting with newcomers later, listening about their lives, and introducing them to others. As the old saying goes: "We do not have a second chance to make a first impression."

I encourage you each week to look for those you don't know, and make it a priority to talk to them first. You can always call a friend later to catch up, but this may be the only opportunity to connect with a visitor or someone new.

Some are so afraid that they might mistake someone new that really has been there for years. Perhaps the safest way to introduce yourself is "Hi, I am \_\_\_\_\_\_; I am not sure if I have met you before." Maybe you both have been a part of the same church, but don't know each other. It is time to build a relationship. If you see someone sitting or standing by themselves, join them, strike up a conversation. Tell them you're glad to have met them, and introduce them to one other person.

We like to think of ourselves as a family. The real test is to see if newcomers are made to feel this way, or if they feel like they are "crashing" someone else's family reunion.

### **Building Bridges With Water-Car Wash Water!**

When was the last time you got something for nothing-absolutely no strings attached? That's what makes the idea of having a free car wash such a great bridge builder.

Pastor Roger says it is one of the best ways to build community, across generations, within a congregation and to build bridges to the community. Few things come without strings attached these days, so this is a tangible, fun way to serve those in our community and build a positive impression of Westminster.

Here's the key: we will not accept donations of any kind, and all signage will share this fact. To make this work, however, will take between 30-to-35 individuals to donate a Saturday morning. Fortunately, we will use the event to build up partnerships with Gospel Mission, the new church that will begin worshiping at Westminster on July 6, and Gospel Tabernacle (partner of Gospel Mission), and Narcotics Anonymous, which meets at Westminster three times week.

The free car wash is scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 10. We'll have devotions, prayers and set-up at 9 and then wash cars from ten-to-noon. After that, we'll have celebration lunch for our volunteers. For those who come through the car wash line, we'll provide refreshments and a blessing card.

If you're thinking, "Why would I want to wash cars," there are other ways to help, too, including making refreshments for people who come through the car wash, handing out blessing cards and standing on the street inviting people to come.

Please let Pastor Roger know if you would be able to help. It's a great way to make a difference!

#### **Session Notes**

Westminster Session met Tuesday, June 18 at 6:30 p.m. in the Atrium. Pastor Roger Grandia opened with prayer. Members then went around the room sharing a significant event or activity that has been key in their spiritual journeys. Session also approved the following:

- Upgrades to church security including both surveillance and video recording cameras, keyless and programmable entry and remote door release (rather than walking to the front door to open). This was a Long View project with features that were added. Total cost: \$18,145 plus a monthly maintenance fee of \$75.
- New icemaker in the FLC kitchen. The old one could no longer be repaired. Total cost: \$2,207.00 plus delivery and installation.
- Annual fundraiser for Ecumenical Community Center to be held Oct. 26 from 2-to-5 p.m. in the Family Life Center.
- Heard from and accepted Linda Woods as a new member.

Meeting adjourned at approximately 8:20 with the group holding hands and saying the Lord's Prayer, led by Pastor Roger.
